We are planning for a very busy growing season and making changes to the gardens to improve and expand. One of our most noticeable improvements will be synthetic sod on the wedding lawn. The upgrade will also help by saving thousands of gallons of water, fertilizer, and time mowing. We are also planning on building a seasonal butterfly house focusing on native butterflies. It will contain educational opportunities as well as being a delight for visitors. There will be more on this project and how you can be involved coming up.

We have grown into a very nice garden with much to offer our visitors. We are always in need of more volunteers to help tend our gardens.
